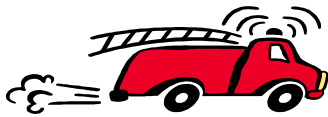

### **BUILDING FIRE EVACUATION**

1. When the Fire Alarm sounds EVACUATE the building IMMEDIATELY isolate the fire by closing and not locking the doors behind you as you evacuate the building.
2. Activate Fire Alarm System by pulling one of the manual pull stations or calling 9-1-1 from the outside
3. Do not waste time collecting personal property.
4. Feel doors to see if they are hot before opening them.
5. If smoke is present, crawl low where the air is fresher and cooler.
6. Do not re-enter the building after evacuation without fire department approval.
7. Evacuate the building using the primary escape route. If the primary escape route is unsafe or blocked, use the secondary escape route. Use stairways not elevators.
8. All residents will meet outside the building at the furthest point of the parking lot away from the building. Beware and avoid interfering with fire department operations as they enter the complex. Management and neighbors should communicate to the fire department any disabled persons that may have trouble evacuating the building.

**FIRE SAFETY TIPS** In general, the most common causes of residential fires are unattended cooking fires, improperly discarded smoking materials, unattended candle fires, and damaged or faulty electrical equipment. Please use the following safety tips:

- Never leave cooking unattended, keep your kitchen areas and appliances clean, and keep combustible materials away from the stove and oven.
- Discard smoking materials in properly designed ash trays
- Never leave candles burning unattended, use properly designed noncombustible candle holders, and place candles on a sturdy surface away from combustible materials and out of reach from children and pets.
- Don't use extension cords as a permanent substitute for inadequate house wiring. Don't use extension cords that are worn or damaged.
